Fire training for the month of February was Ice Rescue. This is a training held annually so that we can maintain proficiency as this is a skill not utilized consistently. This training was held at the Rinsky property on Leuders Road. The Rinsky family has hosted this training for us for 6 years. E.M.S. Training we worked with the new cardiac monitors. Personnel were introduced to the new features of these monitors. They are in service and ready to provide care to the residents of Wayne Township. For these new Heart Monitors FEMA paid \$97,008.81. Wayne Township’s share for this equipment is \$5,105.73

The old heart monitors were removed from service. We received a \$21,077.88 trade in credit towards the purchase of the new monitors. The invoice has been submitted to FEMA for payment. Payment was Authorized on February 21, 2023. The invoice has been e mailed to Fiscal Officer.

Fire Academy courses are continuing. Holding these courses allows our personnel to sit in and get continuing education hours. It also at times gives our personnel the ability to practice their skills along the side of the students and gives the student in my opinion a better learning experience from the members experience.

Lt. Wright has been enrolled in a Fire Inspectors Course.

Roads – Jason Browning

- Roof repair needed at Plainview Cemetery and Salt Barn at 6320 ST RT 133. Will be getting bids.
- Roof at 794 Wright Street, Administration Building, need bids to remove all unused appliances, sky lights and re-roof. Rubber roof, 20 year life span. Resurfaced rubber roof, TPO 20-30% more than rubber. The labor is about the same cost but more on material. Current roof is tarred, need drains on sides, not on center.
- Mr Ritter spoke about solar panels on the Administrative Building. The Board asked him to check on the cost of solar panels for Station 56 at 6306 ST RT 133.
- Mr. Browning, Maintenance Supervisor, gave quotes to the Board in regard to a new zero turn mower. Kubota, Ex Mark, Gravely, and John Deere. The ex mark under State bid from Baxla Tractor is the best built at \$10,900.
